Child Centered Approach: proven AMI Montessori philosophy which honors the natural curiosity and passion in every child.

Highly Trained Staff: Head classroom teachers hold a diploma from the Association Montessori International and are assisted by teachers who are bilingual and consistently speak their native language in the classroom.

World Exposure: A curriculum which celebrates the diversity of people, customs, language, flora, fauna of the world inspires wonder in children and has social, cognitive, and educational and benefits which last a lifetime.

Community Participation: The multi-aged classroom provides a means for even the youngest child to contribute. Older children may extend this participation to the larger community.

Toddler Classroom (2 – 3 years old)

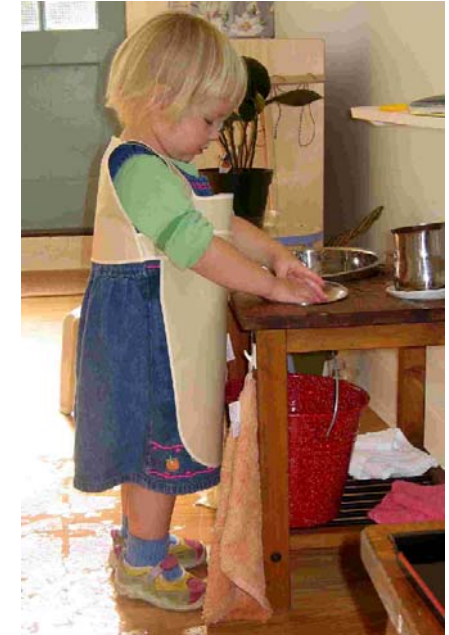
- Monday through Thursday

EXPOSURE TO THE WORLD



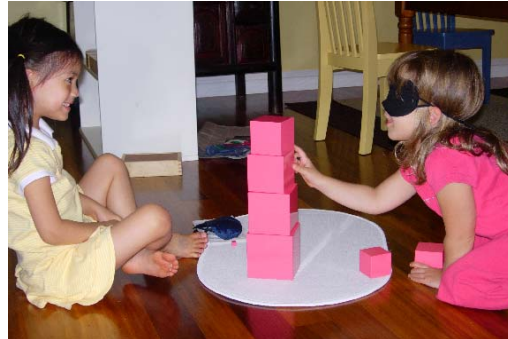
At Centennial, we believe that by exposing children to the wealth of diversity found in the world they grow up naturally comfortable in the global community and respectful of the riches found in the natural environment.

- Our children grow up exposed to many cultures and are better able to respect the diversity of man and the responsibilities and achievements of mankind.
- Early language exposure and exposure to different natural environments helps children form an emotional and cognitive attachment to different parts of their world.
- Children under six are in a sensitive period for language acquisition and exposure thus forms a basis for later fluency.

We incorporate Mandarin and Spanish into the classroom by using two teacher assistants who only speak the target language. Our toddler classroom is primarily English.

THE MONTESSORI PHILOSOPHY

The Montessori philosophy was developed by the first female Italian physician, Dr. Maria Montessori through scientific observation of children from many countries and every socioeconomic class. Her method has been supported by psychologists, educators, and cognitive research throughout the last 100 years. Further, Dr. Montessori's understanding of the developing child has formed a foundation for the work of many developmental scientists including: Jean Piaget, Erik Erickson, and T. Berry Brazelton.
